#### **ANNUAL IMPLEMENTATION PLAN (AIP)**

The school Leadership Team has recently signed off on the 2018 AIP,. This will now be reviewed by our Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) and we will receive feedback. I will be meeting with our SEIL next week to discuss our 2019 plan of action.

#### PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES (PLC)

Last week we received formal notification that we have been accepted into the PLC initiative for 2019. We were nominated by our SEIL to participate in this initiative and will receive some significant funding to attend the training.

The Victorian Professional Learning Community (PLC) initiative supports Victorian government schools to build effective PLCs. Participating schools are at the forefront of working collaboratively to improve student learning outcomes.

Victorian PLC schools commit to using a consistent and structured cycle of data-driven inquiry to inform classroom practice. Their leaders give teacher teams - the building blocks of PLCs - time and support to plan, implement and evaluate high-impact teaching and learning programs.

The staff are very excited about undertaking this professional learning to support the improvement of learning outcomes for our students.

#### **FACILITIES**

School Council has approved some refurbishment work in Block A (Administration and current Junior School). This is anticipated to be conducted over the school holiday period. We will be re-carpeting the whole block and re-painting the corridor areas. This part of the school was targeted as the most critical area of focus and will certainly improve the overall look of our school facility.

#### **COMMONWEALTH BANKING**

Over recent weeks we have had messages in the school newsletter regarding our weekly student banking. Unfortunately we have now had to make the decision to stop Commonwealth banking through the school, due to the lack of participation and interest.

#### **MUSIC NEWS**

It has been busy and festive in the music room! Students have been learning songs and dances for our upcoming Christmas concert on Wednesday 12th December. As well as all this festive music, students have also been exploring creating and composing our own music.

The junior students used unusual percussion instruments to create sounds of a thunderstorm. They used changes in tempo and dynamics to mimic the guiet and loud sounds of the rain, wind and thunder. The middle school students used glockenspiels and senior students used a range of different instruments to create their own ostinato melody in small groups. Students will continue to work on their melody and add percussion sounds to their songs in the coming weeks.
