#### Principal's Report


#### SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

#### YEAR 3/4 TENNIS: SPORTING SCHOOLS

Over the past 4 weeks the children of Year 3 & 4 have been receiving tennis coaching from local Pearcedale coach Mat Monty from Origin Tennis. This is sponsored through the Sporting Schools program which enables our children to receive free lessons from fully



trained and qualified people within a particular sporting field. The children have focused on ground strokes, volleys and serving and even some of the rules. Last week we put it all together in a game situation. The children have had a great time extending their tennis skills.

#### **FOUNDATION TO YEAR 2 SWIMMING PROGRAM**

We will be offering the children in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 the opportunity to take part in a "Learn To Swim" Program at the Somerville YMCA. The lessons will be held in Term 2. Each lesson will run for 45 minutes on a Monday over a 6 week period. The lessons will commence Monday 6th May—the third week of Term 2. Parents are encouraged to attend the pool during lesson times to support and watch their children.

The swimming program has been running for several years now and we are very pleased with the support families have shown towards these important sessions. Many children who have swimming lessons elsewhere still participate in our school program to further develop their skills. It is vital for all children to have the opportunity to participate in water safety activities and learn to swim. It also offers children the opportunity to experience a new sport which will enhance their physical wellbeing and to experience a whole group activity to build independence.



# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

# CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.


