

St John Ambulance will visit our school on Tuesday 17th and Thursday 19th September to deliver free First Aid in Schools training to our students. Through the First Aid in Schools program, a trained St John presenter, will lead students from all classes through tailored sessions on the importance of First Aid and what to do in the event of an emergency.

Our junior students will learn about how to identify when there is an emergency, keeping themselves safe, and how to call for an ambulance. Senior students learn about delivering CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and the things they can do to assist in an emergency. Participating students will be receiving a first aid certificate.
