#### MUSIC ROOM NEWS

The Baxter Primary School choir has once again been invited to perform at Karingal Hub as part of the Sounds of Christmas event this year. We will be performing on Tuesday 3rd December at 11:30am in the Centre court area of Karingal Hub. I hope to see many of you there to support our school choir students.

This year our Christmas concert, to be held on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> December, will have a radical '80's theme. Not only have classes been singing some old and new Christmas tunes but they have also been focusing on dance as part of the music program. 


