MULTI-AGE CLASSROOMS IN 2020

As part of our 'Up Day' yesterday, your children spent the majority of the day in their classroom with their new teacher for next year.

Listed below are the great benefits this structure will provide our school.

BENEFITS

- **Flexibility** – Multi-aging gives us options, being a small school we now have the ability to separate cohorts for a number of different reasons (including social, emotional and physical factors).
- **Teacher's planning** – multi-aging fits in perfectly with our Professional Learning Communities (PLC) model, teachers will be able to plan and share their resources more effectively.
- Gender balance issues within cohorts can now be addressed.
- The structure enables us to match teachers to particular students' needs.
- As the school gets bigger the need for multi-aging will only become more prevalent as our numbers grow. We are anticipating 175 students next year, whereas 2 years ago we only had 138 enrolments.

As a staff we have spent a significant amount of time strategically placing the students into their new classes.

The students were placed according to a sound educational, social mix, not entirely based on friendships but on the best possible learning environment we can develop. We want all children to be friendly but also develop new friendships. Class time is the time to learn and work diligently.

WHAT THE RESEARCH SAYS...

- Research, predominantly conducted in primary schools, suggests that there is no discernable difference between multi age and straight grade classes in terms of academic performance.
- Multi-age classes support the theory that children should be taught in stages not ages.

- Positive outcomes in classrooms are more dependent on the quality of teaching more than anything else.
- Grade structures are immaterial and schools should be providing a differentiated curriculum, one that caters to all children as individuals, according to their needs.
- Younger students in a multi-age setting generally aspire to emulate older children in their work, and older children enjoy leadership and mentoring opportunities that lift their self-esteem.
- Multi age classrooms are more flexible, allow children to work at their own pace, offer a wider range of friendship opportunities and encourage more cooperation and tolerance.
- This structure is not uncommon in Victoria, in fact almost half of all state primary schools are multi age.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Dear Parents.

The commencement of any new school year can be a very difficult time financially for some families. If you perhaps think that back to school expenses are going to cause difficulties, we do have a number of organisations that may be able to assist.

Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund (CSEF) is a government benefit to assist with school activities and is available to parents that hold an eligible health care card.

CSEF will be automatic, if you successfully applied and received it at Baxter Primary School this year. No new application form is necessary.

You will need to complete a new application form if:

- You transferred in part way through the year and your application for 2019 was at a different school
- Your circumstances changed this year and you are now an eligible health care card holder

State Schools Relief (SSR) may be able to assist struggling families with uniform.

Foundation students whose parents received CSEF will automatically be eligible for a winter uniform pack. The winter uniform pack contains long pants, a jumper and shoes.

Schools can apply to SSR for assistance on behalf of parents. Please contact the office for further information.

Westernport Community Support (WCS) in Hastings and/or Frankston have also contacted us and said they may be able to assist struggling families.

Depending on individual circumstances, they may be able to assist with the cost of stationery supplies and uniform.

You can contact WCS on 5979 2762 to make an appointment directly with them.

School Payment Plans can be negotiated at the office. We will always endeavour to support parents wherever we can, if we are aware you are facing difficulties.

All enquiries will be treated with respect and in the strictest confidence. I encourage you to contact me directly to discuss your circumstances.

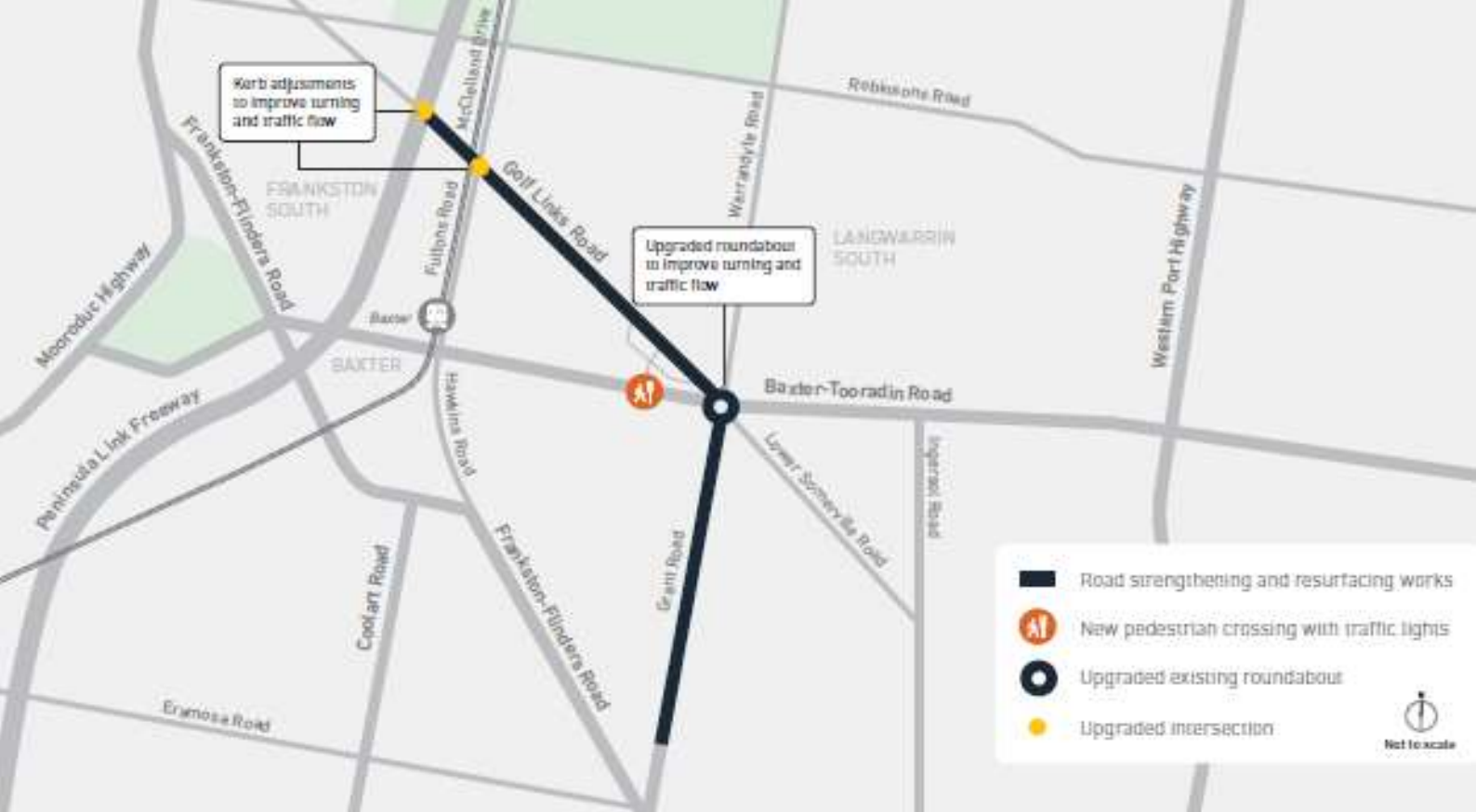

The upgrade will:

- make it safer for you to get to Peninsula Link, Somerville, Hastings and Western Port Highway
- make it safer for trucks to get to Grant Road and the Somerville commercial precinct
- lower the risk and severity of crashes by adding safety barriers.

Construction impacts

We're committed to minimising impacts to the local community and all road users during construction. We'll keep you informed and provide advanced notice of scheduled disruptions.

Given the number of transport projects underway across Victoria, we'll maintain a coordinated approach with other projects to minimise disruptions.

Safety improvements

As part of the Golf Links Road Upgrade, we'll rebuild the road surface and add safety barriers along the side of the road. These changes will improve safety for all road users by reducing the likelihood and severity of crashes.

We'll also install traffic lights at the Baxter-Tooradin Road pedestrian crossing outside Baxter Primary School. This will improve safety for students and parents walking between the school, bus stops and nearby carpark.

Environment

We're committed to minimising impacts on the local environment, while we build safer and more accessible roads for everyone. We'll always work to minimise the number of trees that need to be removed. Where vegetation impacts cannot be avoided, we'll seek opportunities to offset these impacts and plant more trees in the area.

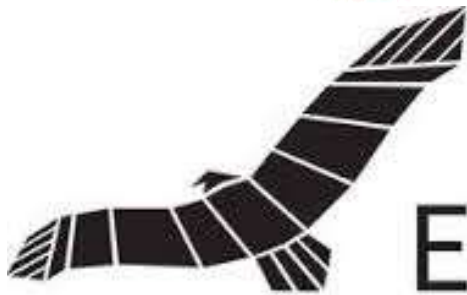

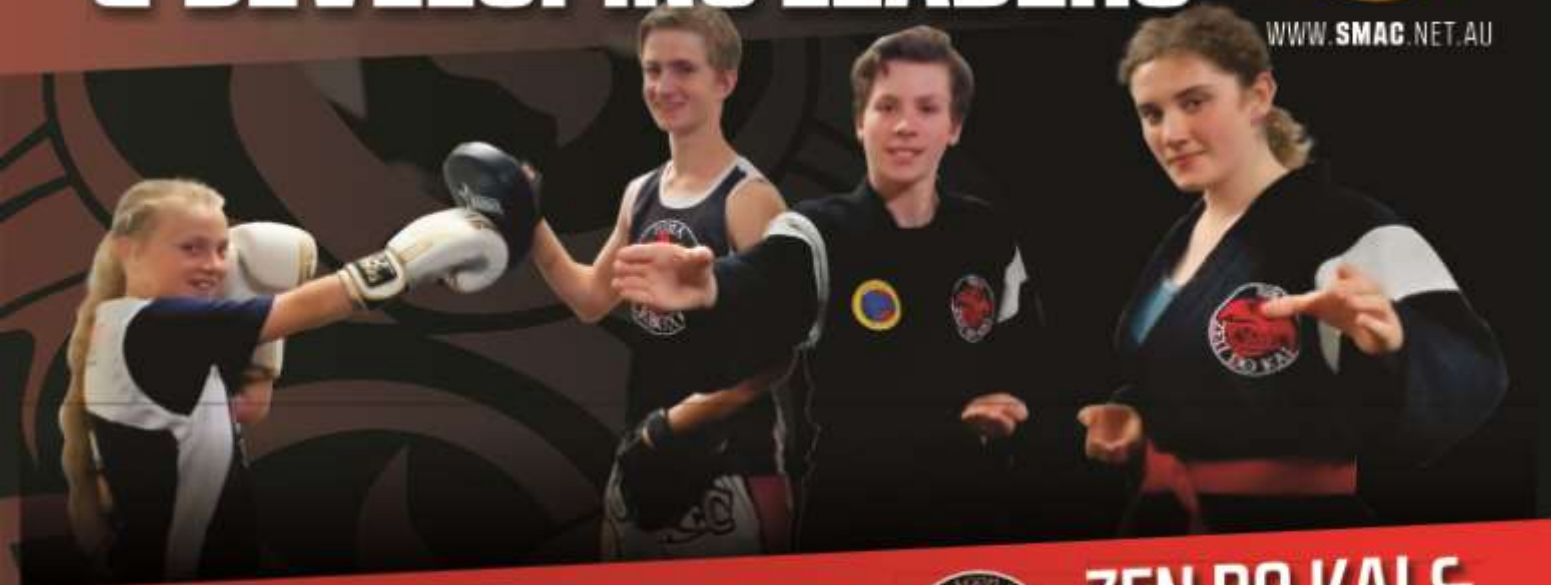
